## GCU Generic Awards<sup>1</sup>

GCU Generic Award regulations provide a safety net for any student failing up to and including 40 credits on their chosen programme of study. In such circumstances, the Progression and Award Board will have the opportunity to recommend transfer to the appropriate School-based Generic Award. This guidance should be read in conjunction with the School-Based Generic Award Regulations, outlined within the <u>Assessment Regulations</u>.

Where a Progression and Award Board recommends that an international student should transfer to a Generic Award, the student must take advice from the GCU Visa, Immigration Support and Advice Team (VISA), as this may have implications for those on a General Student Visa (Tier 4) visa.

Academic Schools are responsible for identifying the modules which make up the credit deficit at each level.

There is no progression pathway through a Generic Award as it is intended solely for students who are up to 40 credits short of an exit award<sup>2</sup>. Consequently, on successful completion, students exit with a University award at that level.

Utilising the flexibility of the Scottish Credit and Qualification Framework (SCQF) and assuming students have at least 80 credits at the level of the award, the approved credit requirements<sup>3</sup> to achieve a Generic Award exit point are as follows:

	Credit Requirements
Exit Awards	(where 40 credits have been failed)
Certificate of Higher Education	40 SCQF Level 7 credits
120 credit points with a minimum of 90 at Level 7	
Diploma of Higher Education	20 SCQF Level 7 and 20 SCQF Level 8
240 credit points with a minimum of 90 at SCQF Level 8	credits
Scottish Bachelors Degree	40 SCQF Level 7, 8 or 9 credits
360 credit points with a minimum of 60 at SCQF Level 9	
Scottish Bachelors Degree with Honours	20 SCQF credits at Level 7, 8, 9 or 10,
480 credit points with a minimum of 90 at SCQF Level 10	and 20 SCQF Level 10 credits

Where a student has failed less than 40 credits on their chosen programme of study (i.e. 20 credits), and meets the minimum SCQF credit requirements at the level of study, it will be a matter for the Academic School to identify a replacement module, adhering to the approved credit requirements noted above.

Schools should take advice from the Department of Quality Assurance and Enhancement should a Generic Award at Masters Level be required.
