Our Chancellor

Dr Anne-Marie Imafidon MBE HonFREng HonFBSA HonFIET, an inspirational trailblazer in business, maths and technology.

One of the UK's most influential women in tech and a leading advocate of diversifying talent in science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM), Dr Anne-Marie Imafidon MBE HonFREng HonFBSA HonFIET was appointed Chancellor of Glasgow Caledonian University in February this year.

Dr Imafidon is a trailblazer in the fields of business, mathematics and technology and has received a host of accolades. These include an MBE in 2017 for her services to young women and the STEM fields. She was named the UK IT Industry and British Computer Society's Young IT Professional of the Year in 2013, and, in 2020, the UK's Most Influential Woman in Tech by *Computer Weekly*, the same year she was appointed a NATO2030 Young Leader. In 2021 Dr Imafidon began a run as temporary Arithmetician for 60 episodes of Channel 4's *Countdown*, the world's longest-running game show.

As co-founder of the award-winning organisation Stemettes, Dr Imafidon has spearheaded initiatives to inspire the next generation of girls and young women in STEM careers, reaching more than 65,000 young people across the UK, Ireland and Europe.

Dr Imafidon chairs the UD Music Foundation, an Arts Council National Portfolio charity bringing communities together through music education, Black music and Black-music culture, and co-chairs the Institute for the Future of Work, an independent research and development body exploring how new technologies are transforming our working lives.

A sought-after presenter, keynote speaker and adviser, Dr Imafidon continues to make significant contributions to the advancement of women in technology, and, in 2022, wrote *She's in CTRL, Transworld*, a guide to women's empowerment through digital literacy.

Dr Imafidon is an honorary graduate of the University, though her remarkable learning journey also includes passing GCSEs at the age of 10, becoming the youngest girl to pass A-level computing at 11, and earning a Master's degree in Mathematics and Computer Science from the University of Oxford aged just 20. Dr Imafidon embodies our University values: confidence, creativity, integrity and responsibility.







Graduation ceremony

The celebration is a blend of old and new traditions.

Your graduation ceremony is a blend of centuries of academic history woven with the University's own traditions.

The ceremony draws together our community to mark the award of degrees or other achievements and celebrate your success with pride as you reach a milestone in your journey with us. It begins with the academic anthem, Gaudeamus Igitur (Let Us Rejoice), and graduands (students about to have their degrees conferred) and their guests stand as the academic procession enters. The procession usually includes our Chancellor, Vice-Chancellor, Vice-Principals, senior staff, members of the University Court and Senate, distinguished honorary graduands and the Bedellus.

The Bedellus carries the Caledonian Mace - the symbol of our independence and authority to confer degrees. Ceremonial maces' roots can be traced to the Middle Ages when they would be used as weapons to protect the monarch and, subsequently, university leaders. Our richly decorated ceremonial Mace celebrates our motto, For the Common Weal, and was designed

by The Glasgow School of Art and gifted by the universities of Glasgow and Strathclyde. The Mace was the first to be produced in Scotland for a Scottish university in more than 100 years.

Degrees are conferred, or awarded, by our Chancellor, Vice-Chancellor (our Principal and executive head of the University), or by our Chair of Court – our supreme governing body.

Our students are presented by the Dean, the most senior academic of each of our Schools, and are then capped – signifying that your degree has been awarded and you are now a graduate. The award given to each graduating student is based on the level of their study and their course (there's a guide to our degrees and the academic dress associated with them on the page opposite).

Alongside our own students, we also award honorary degrees to public figures who embody our values in recognition of their outstanding achievements in their sphere. The ceremony usually closes with an address from the Principal and Vice-Chancellor.





Graduation robes

Glasgow Caledonian University's hoods and robes reflect the variety and diversity of our academic programmes.

The origins of today's academic dress – including the robe and hood worn by our students – can be traced back to medieval Europe's earliest universities when students adopted long, sober clothing to reflect their scholarly status. While every-day fashions have changed, the often flamboyantly coloured robes have remained an integral part of academic ceremonies – undoubtedly adding to the sense of occasion at graduation.

The introduction, in 2010, of the various richly hued graduation robes and hoods that are associated with each of our degrees was a landmark in our

history and illustrates our pride in our past and present, and in our ambitions for the future. The coloured hoods associated with each degree - illustrated above - replaced the uniform academic dress that had remained unchanged since we were awarded university status in 1993 and celebrate the diversity of achievement of our 21st-century graduates who come from all over the world.

Members of our academic procession wear the academic dress associated with the university from which they graduated, creating the vibrant variety of colours you'll see at today's ceremony.

Award of Honorary Degree of Doctor of the University

Chief Executive of One Parent Families Scotland and Co-chair of The Just Transition Commission, Satwat Rehman has more than 30 years' experience in the equalities, education, employability, economic development, regeneration and childcare fields.

Satwat's remarkable career as a champion for equality began when she was a teenager. After moving to Edinburgh in 1989, her work with the city's Multicultural Education Centre and involvement with Lothian Black Forum inspired her to establish Lothian Campaign Against Racism and Fascism.

She joined One Parent Families Scotland in 2011. Scotland's leading charity for single-parent families, it offers expert advice and practical support as well as campaigning alongside parents on the systems, policies and attitudes that disadvantage single-parent families.

Co-chair of the Just Transition Commission in Scotland, an independent advisory body helping the country deliver a just transition to a low-carbon economy, Satwat has also been a member of commissions and advisory groups including the First Minister's National Advisory Council on Women and Girls and the Scottish Government's Social Renewal Advisory Board. She is on the boards of Wellbeing Economy Alliance Scotland and Child Poverty Action Group (UK).

Satwat has championed the work of Glasgow Caledonian University's Scottish Poverty and Inequality Research Unit, advising on its research projects, helping the unit recruit research project participants, and disseminating its findings. She has also shared her wealth of expertise in the field with our MSc Human Rights students.

Glasgow Caledonian University is a dynamic, world-leading, award-winning institution that is shaping society, influencing global policy and transforming lives.

Glasgow Caledonian – the largest and leading modern university in Scotland - is a vibrant, values-led university with campuses in the heart of Glasgow and London. With a strong commitment to high-quality education and research which supports the communities we serve, our partnerships with employers help students get the careers they dream of and deserve.

With a wide range of professionally accredited courses and links with over 300 industry partners, we have the highest proportion of graduates in highly skilled occupations (82%) compared to other Scottish modern universities - with 91% of our students in employment or further study within 15 months of graduating (HESA 2024). We are Scotland's leading provider of Graduate Apprenticeships.

Named UK Modern University of the Year in the latest *Daily Mail University Guide*, we have risen to become one of the top 50 universities in the UK in the highly regarded *Times and Sunday Times University Guide*, and ranked 46 in the *Guardian's* latest guide. We are the top

performing modern university in Scotland in all three guides.

We perform exceptionally at subject level too. We're the leading university in the UK in key health areas including Radiography and Physiotherapy, and in the top three for Subjects allied to Medicine, and Hospitality, Leisure, Recreation and Tourism (first in Scotland), according to the *Times* and *Sunday Times*. The latest *Guardian University Guide* also ranked Glasgow Caledonian University first in the UK for Social Work, third for Games Design and in the top 10 for Marketing (first in Scotland) and Hospitality, Event Management and Tourism.

Helping more young people from diverse backgrounds into university is something we are extremely passionate about. Scottish Funding Council figures highlighted that 22% of our Scottish full-time, first-degree entrants were drawn from the country's 20% most-disadvantaged backgrounds (SFC 2023). An independent economic impact report highlighted that Glasgow Caledonian is a valuable asset to the City of Glasgow, not only bringing economic and



employment opportunities, but working to address the deep-rooted economic, social and health inequalities in the city (BiGGAR Economics).

Our College Connect Team delivers a dedicated service to help students transition from college to university, and the University's Caledonian Club, an award-winning outreach initiative, has helped 20,000 local children, families and carers, many from disadvantaged backgrounds.

At heart, we are a civic university with a global outlook, dedicated to driving positive social change for current and future generations. In the 2024 *Times Higher Education Impact Rankings*, which assess universities against the Sustainable Development Goals, we ranked in the top 200 globally. Within this, we ranked first in Scotland for three goals - Gender Equality (3rd in the UK), Good Health and Wellbeing (4th in the UK), and Decent Work and Economic Growth (10th in the UK).

We are the only Scottish university with EcoCampus Platinum accreditation and were ranked first in Scotland for sustainability in the most recent People and Planet league table.

Our research is addressing many of today's biggest global challenges. We are unsurpassed by any other Scottish modern university for the level of research (72%) considered to be world leading or internationally excellent. Our health research is surpassed only by King's College London for outstanding impact, and 100% of our communications, culture and media research is rated as having an outstanding or very considerable impact (REF2021).

The University's globally recognised researchers regularly advise governments, industry and international bodies on policy development and delivering impact. Research expertise spans three Schools (the School of Computing, Engineering and Built Environment, the Glasgow School for Business and Society, and our School of Health and Life Sciences) and centres including the Research Centre for Health (ReaCH), Mary Robinson Centre for Climate Justice, and Yunus Centre for Social Business and Health.

Our close partnerships range from the Scottish Government, Public Health Scotland and NHS Scotland to the Chambers of Commerce and Scottish Women in Technology. We have transnational partnerships in China, South Africa, Oman, Bangladesh and Mauritius.

Our success as a globally connected University is demonstrated by the large number of international students studying at our UK campuses. We achieved excellent results in the latest International Student Barometer, with 94% satisfaction ratings for the learning experience, arrival experience and happiness with life at Glasgow Caledonian. Our welcoming community of over 1,600 staff and more than 23,000 students from over 130 countries enjoy state-of-the-art facilities across each of our city centre campuses.

Guided by our values – integrity, responsibility, creativity and confidence – we work with others to transform the lives of our students and the communities we serve.
