GETTING AROUND GLASGOW



Glasgow Caledonian is easily reached either on foot or via public transport links, whether you're staying in student accommodation or commuting.

Subway

The Subway offers the most convenient way to travel around **Glasgow's City Centre** and **West End**. Trains run every four minutes.

Bus

You'll find Scotland's largest bus terminal, **Buchanan Bus Station**, right next to our campus. Buchanan Bus Station connects you to major cities and towns across Scotland and the UK.

Train

The University is a short walk from Glasgow's two main railway stations: **Glasgow Queen Street** and **Glasgow Central**, just 10 minutes from Queen Street and 15 from Central. Both offer excellent transport links across the UK.



OVO Bikes

OVO Bikes are an affordable and eco-friendly way of getting around Glasgow. With stations scattered throughout the city, just locate a nearby **OVO Bike** on the **Nextbike app** scan it and ride!

If you're moving away from home, there are lots of options for living in Glasgow. If you want to apply for a place in Caledonian Court – our on-campus residences – or want to rent privately, our dedicated team is on hand to help you make your move.



Here's what Caledonian Court has to offer:

Prime location: Positioned in the heart of Glasgow's City Centre, right next to the University campus.

Safe and supportive environment: Round-the-clock security and support.

Modern facilities: Enjoy modern self-catering accommodation with fully equipped kitchens.

Inclusive amenities: Heating, electricity, and internet are all included in the rent.

Affordable pricing: 24/25 academic year costs for 41 weeks start at \pounds 125 per week for rooms with shared bathroom facilities and \pounds 148 per week for those with en-suite facilities.











SAAS funding

If you're an eligible student from Scotland, the Student Awards Agency for Scotland (SAAS) provides financial assistance to help cover a range of higher education expenses.

Tuition fee loan: covers tuition fees and is paid directly to the university or college **Maintenance loan:** supports living expenses including accommodation costs **Bursaries and grants:** SAAS provides additional bursaries and grants based on financial need, personal circumstances, and academic achievement.

How to apply to SAAS

- Meet specific eligibility criteria
- Complete an online application form
- Submit required documentation





Scholarships and bursaries


The best way to get a taste of life at Glasgow Caledonian is to visit us, whether in person at one of our Open Days, or virtually at one of our online events.
